

## Enneagram 27 Personality Subtypes Beyond Just One Number

Combining the passion of the type with its expression through one of the natural instinctual drives (self-preservation, social, relational) provides a deeper and more complete understanding of the forces operating at our core, usually unconsciously. Beatrice Chestnut has been instrumental in bringing this aspect of the Enneagram into focus. This 9-week series will explore this important dimension which when not understood is often the source of mistyping and other confusions. 
## THE ENNEAGRAM SYSTEM'S 27 PERSONALITY SUBTYPES



What are the Enneagram subtypes? The Enneagram describes three centers of human intelligence — the head, heart, and body. Each triad then divides into three to create nine interconnected personality types. These types also each have their own triad — the third level of three — the 27 subtypes. Subtypes are based on whether a person has a predominant instinctual drive toward Self-Preservation, Social interaction in groups, or One-to-One bonding. These 27 "sub-type" descriptions offer an even more nuanced view of the personality types than the nine types alone, shedding light on our most unconscious level of functioning so we can become more self-aware.
